Elliot: That's one, two, three, four guesses. [chuckles] I mean guests.

Lisa: Awesome. Have all the guests arrived?

Cowy: Well, I made six invitations but I'm not sure. I am not too good at counting.

Speaker 2: You can do it, Cowy. Who else did you invite?

Cowy: My doll, Snuggles.

Lisa: That's one more.

Cowy: And me, Cowy, so I guess that's two.

[whistling]

Speaker 2: It sounds like you have a whole dinner party team. Just let your friends know how they can help.

Cowy: Thanks, everybody. Okay, we need one plate for each guest.

Lisa: Got it. Six plates coming up.

[music]

Cowy: We need a big pile of napkins in the middle.

Lisa: Classy.

Elliot: Oh, I can do the forks. One, two, three, four, five, six. Yes, nailed it.

Cowy: We're almost done.

[whistling]

Speaker 2: Oh, Billy says he prefers to eat with his beak, no fork for him.

[croaking]

Lisa: Cynthia says she prefers to eat with her tongue, no fork for her.

Cowy: How can we set the table right when everything keeps changing?

Lisa: Don't worry, Cowy. We'll help you figure it out. If you have six forks on the table,

how many forks do you need to take off the table?

Cowy: Let me think. Music, please.

Cowy: Please, take away one fork for Billy.

Lisa: That leaves five.

Cowy: Take away another fork for Cynthia.

Lisa: That leaves four. Four forks. Nailed it. Actually, forked it. [chuckles]

Lisa: You mean like a double scoop of ice cream?
