Elliot: What are you doing?

Presenter: I am drawing. Actually, I am decorating Easter Eggs and I am using this pattern - ziig-zaag, dot, dot, zig-zag.. Do you want to join me, Cowy?

Cowy: Sure! Zig-zag, dot, dot, zig-zag, dot, dot....

Presenter: Now, Do you know what a pattern is?

Cowy: When you pat someone a lot?

Presenter: ha-ha Cowy. I think I should explain it first! A pattern is simply a combination of things that repeat over and over. You can find and create patterns with colors, shapes, music and more.

Cowy: wow!

Presenter: Using combinations of colors that repeat is a great way to create a pattern! For example the Flag of the United States of America has a very recognizable pattern—do you know what colors it uses in its pattern?

Lisa: Red, white, and blue!

Presenter: That's Correct Lisa! What are you going to do for your drawing, Cowy?

Cowy: I'm going to draw polka dots and triangles!

Presenter: That's a great idea, Cowy! Using shapes is another way to make a pattern. Polka dots, stripes, checkered patterns—there are so many possibilities!

Billy: Chirp, chirp!

Presenter: Yes Billy, you can also use different kinds of lines to make patterns; the trick is to repeat your pattern!

Elliot: What do you mean?

Presenter: Well Elliot, for example, you could draw a straight line, then a wavy line below, and then a zig-zag line below that, and repeat! Say it with me, Lingokids Listeners! Straight, wavy, zig-zag—straight, wavy, zig-zag—straight, zig-zag—

Elliot: Wait! You forgot to say wavy before zig-zag!

Presenter: Great catch, Elliot! Patterns are important because they help create a sense of order, so when that order changes, it usually stands out, as you can see!

Elliot: How fun!

Presenter: Patterns can even be found in nature. Can you think of any animals with patterns?

Elliot: A zebra with black and white stripes!

Cowy: A ladybug with polka dots!

Lisa: A spotted cheetah!

Presenter: Those are all great examples! I'm sure we could think of so many more!

Billy: Chirp, chirp, chirp!

Presenter: Ah yes, you're right Billy! Patterns aren't just found in things that we see. They can also be found in things that we hear. Birds sing different patterns of notes all the time, right Billy?
