

Practice Activities

Boost your child's knowledge of the key words by trying out these fun activities.




Key words:

Octopus, shark, crab, starfish, whale, seahorse.

DOMINOS

Help your child create a domino-related activity to practice this lesson's vocabulary. Grab a piece of paper and use a marker to divide it in half (vertically). Now divide it into 6 equal parts horizontally. Ask your child to write the name of the 6 animals on the left side of the tiles, and then alternate the drawings of the animals so that they are *not* matching the word on their left. In order to match two tiles, your child will have to join the tile with the drawing, and the tile with the word representing that animal. If you want to make it more difficult, we suggest you take advantage of this activity to include previously learned vocabulary.



OCEAN BOOKLET

Have your child create a booklet to represent everything they have learned in this lesson. The idea is for them to include a drawing of this lesson's vocabulary as well as labels of the key words. They can even illustrate a story including the different animals, it is OK if there is no dialogue, an image can be worth a thousand words! Once the booklet is completed, they can show it to their friends and other family members to help them learn the new vocabulary as well.

Progress Tracker

Try these activities with your child to assess their knowledge of the key words. You can do this as many times as you like to see how they are progressing. Mark the table with the words they know and don't know, and watch how they improve over time!

Key words:

TRACKER ACTIVITY 1

Have your child create flashcards including drawings representing this lesson's vocabulary. Lay them out in a line along the floor with some space between each card. The child will jump and say the flashcard they land next to, jumping their way down the line of cards. You can make this competitive by timing the child to see how fast they can get to the end of the line.



TRACKER ACTIVITY 2

Mouth one of the key words from this lesson. You can do this either once or twice. Make sure you are not whispering, just mouthing the word! Ask the child: 'What did I say?', let them answer and say the translation in their mother tongue. Repeat this activity as many times as you need in order to cover all the vocabulary, and reverse roles to make it more enjoyable to everyone. Do this as many times as necessary and mark the results accordingly on the table below.

EXTRA CHALLENGE

Try introducing more vocabulary related to aquatic animals such as 'dolphin' or 'jellyfish'. With your child's help, create a set of flashcards that represents the vocabulary in drawings. Grab the flashcards, shuffle them, and show one to your child. While you do that you can either say the word that represents that card or an incorrect one. Your child will have to shout 'TRUE' if it's the correct word, or "FALSE" if they think it's incorrect, (they can say this in their own language or in English). For each correct guess, your child gets to keep the card. To make it more entertaining, you can reverse roles.




Support Practice Activities

Support your child's learning journey by trying out these fun activities.

Octopus, shark, crab, starfish, whale, seahorse.

STAND UP, SIT DOWN

For this activity you will need cut out drawings of the key words (made by your child), and a reusable whiteboard. The child will have the drawings and will show you one. You will have to write the key word representing that drawing. Your child will stand up if the drawing and the word match, or sit down if they don't and then give you the correct answer. Try to write the wrong answer sometimes to spice things up. We suggest you trade roles and celebrate each correct answer by repeating the word together.



FLOUR TRACING

Have your child write this lesson's key words on different pieces of A4 paper using a thick felt tip pen. Then place one of them in a shallow tray and cover it with salt. Your child will trace each word through the salt with their finger while sounding the word out as they trace. What does that word mean in their mother tongue? You can do this activity using flour instead, or shaving cream, or dirt.





Strengthen Skills Activities


Support your child's learning journey by trying out these fun activities.

MASKS

Paper plates are so versatile, they can even transform into shark related masks! Your child will be making a mask with the plate in the style of the different animals they've learned about. They can use a variety of crafting materials such as pipe cleaners and googly eyes to help their mask to be truly authentic, and ask them to add the animal's name on the back of each mask. Make sure to poke two holes in each mask and attach string so the mask holds on the face.



OCEAN LANDSCAPE


Give your child a piece of paper. Tell them to draw a picture including all the aquatic animals they've learned about. Ask them to label each of them. When they are ready, tell them to write some sentences about these animals; together think of some useful structures you may want to use including previously learned words in English. For example: 'The shark is gray', 'The seahorse is small'.

Have your child make a checklist including this lesson's vocabulary. Now go to your city or town's aquarium or zoo if there is one; how many of the animals listed can your child see? It is OK if they don't get to see all of them!




