


### Key words:

## NOISY FARM

Now when you say the name of the animal from the key words, they have to make the noise that animal makes. Repeat as often as necessary.

## Progress Tracker

Try these activities with your child to assess their knowledge of the key words. You can do this as many times as you like to see how they are progressing. Mark the table with the words they know and don't know, and watch how they improve over time!

### Key words:

### TRACKER ACTIVITY 1

Place images or drawings of the key words around the room. Give your child some blowing bubbles.

Now call out one of the key word animals and ask your child to find the correct picture and blow some bubbles in the direction of the correct animal picture.

Repeat this as often as you need to and mark the results accordingly on the table below.



### TRACKER ACTIVITY 2

Place a light dusting of flour on a clean tabletop surface. Now write the word pig in the flour and ask your child to trace it or copy it and tell you which animal it is. Repeat this for the different key word animals. Repeat this as often as you need to and mark the results accordingly on the table below.

## EXTENSION

Use materials that you may be thinking of recycling such as egg boxes, cardboard boxes, toilet roll tubes, plastic containers, etc, to make a mini craft farm with your child. You can use these materials and pieces of paper to help create the animals to live on your farm.



Make sure to include the animals from the key word list but also include other animals such as a goat, turkey, bull, rooster, horse, goose, etc.



Make sure you label each animal with their name and have your child tell you what each of the animals are.



Each time you play with the farm with your child you can ask them to name all the animals to ensure they retain and extend their farm animal vocabulary knowledge.



### Key words:

### ANIMAL PICTONARY

On a piece of paper draw one of the animals from our key words. Your child must try to guess which animal it is that you are drawing. If they manage to guess the animal before you finish drawing, they get a point but if they don't then you get a point. Repeat this with the other animals from the key words. First person to get ten points wins the game.



### ANIMAL CHARADES

### HIDDEN ANIMALS



You will need a variety of animal toys for this next activity. Place them in a feely bag or pillow case and make the noise of the animal before you pull it out of the bag, your child will guess the name of the animal based on your impressions. Now flip this activity round, your child will have the bag of animals, giving your noise clues to guess which animal they have hold of!


### MATCH THE ANIMALS

Together with your child, draw pictures of all the animals from the key word list on a piece of paper then cut out each one. Now write all the key words on another piece of paper and cut out each one. Now hide them around your garden or home. Ask your child to try and find the pictures to match them with their correct word. Give them help if necessary and ask them to read the words aloud if they can.



## EXTENSION

Take your child to a farm and together create a journal by drawing a picture of the animals they see. They can write the name of the animals from the key words (cow, pig, sheep, duck, horse, chick, chicken) and include a field or stable on their drawings, for example. They can also try to draw and write the names of some other animals they see such as donkey, peacock, chick etc.
