





THE ODD ONE

For this activity you will need paper and a marker. The idea is for you to write or draw (depending on your child's reading skills) 3 words that belong to the same category, and add as well one of this lesson's key words. See some ideas below:

- Write/draw 3 letters (A, Q, J) + keyword
- Write/draw 3 fruits (banana, apple, strawberry) + keyword
- Write/draw 3 numbers (six, two, eleven) + keyword
- Write/draw 3 emojis representing feelings (happy, sad, worried) + keyword
- Write/draw 3 clothing items (sock, pants, t-shirt) + keyword



In order to have your child practice the new vocabulary, they will have to name what you are drawing/writing as you are doing it. Whenever you get to represent one of the key words, your child will not only have to call it out by its (correct) name, but will also have to do 2 jumping jacks! You can reverse roles to make it more entertaining.

LANDSCAPE

For this activity you will need colored pencils, crayons, markers, paint etc. Tell your child they must draw a savannah landscape scene including all the key words. We suggest they even label them if you think they are ready to do so! Additionally they can add themselves in their safari scene in a full safari outfit!

Progress Tracker


Try these activities with your child to assess their knowledge of the key words. You can do this as many times as you like to see how they are progressing. Mark the table with the words they know and don't know, and watch how they improve over time!

TRACKER ACTIVITY 1

This is a very simple activity that will help you track your child's progress. The idea is for you to ask them to draw a picture that matches the vocabulary word. Grab a piece of paper and some colored pencils, tell them one of the words, have them write it first (if they can) and then make a drawing of it.



TRACKER ACTIVITY 2

In this activity you will ask your child to act out this lesson's key words. You will ask them to write them down on a piece of paper that you will then cut to separate the words. You will fold each paper and put them in a bowl. How many does your child guess correctly on the first try?

EXTRA CHALLENGE

Try introducing more vocabulary related to safari animals: tiger, monkey. For this activity you will need a large piece of paper and markers. You will need to write down several words in English (i.e. colors, pets, numbers, etc) including this lesson's key words and the new vocabulary. The idea is to lay the paper with all the words on the floor and have your child be standing in front of it. Whenever you read out loud a word that isn't related to Safari animals, your child will have to find it and cross it out. Alternatively, if you say a word related to this lesson's topic, your child will have to find the word, circle it, and repeat it out loud.

TRUE OR FALSE

For this activity you will need: masking tape or chalk, flashcards with the key words on them or animal toys representing the safari animals we've learned about. Draw a line on the floor with tape and designate one side 'True' and the other 'False'. You can write the words on each side if you think that will help your child remember better. Hold up a flashcard or an animal toy and say the key word it represents. If your child thinks that you have said the correct word they jump on the 'True' side, if not they jump on the 'False' side. If you said the 'incorrect' word, your child must tell you the word that matches the flashcard/toy you are holding.



ANIMAL SHADOWS




For this activity you will need animal toys representing the safari animals your child has learned about, papers, and pencils. The idea is for you to go outdoors and find some sunshine. Align the toys so that their shadow appears on the paper! Alternatively, use a light or lamp, but nothing beats the outdoor feeling of sunshine on your back when you draw your animals! We would like for your child to trace the animal's shadows, color them in and label them as well.


GUESS THE WORD

Stand up or sit next to your child and extend your dominant arm all the way out in front of you. Pointing with two fingers, spell the word in the air starting from the left side of the body all the way to the right.

Make the letters at least two feet high! Can your child guess what key word you just wrote? Go over all the new vocabulary and trade roles with your child.

BUILD THE WORDS

For this activity you will need Scrabble tiles, or to create your own alphabet flashcards including several copies of each letter in it. The idea is for you to say a word out loud and for your child to select the correct Scrabble tiles to spell it. Alternatively, you can say the word in your mother tongue and your child must write its English equivalent; or you can draw the animals and show the drawings to your child so that they can spell the keyword corresponding to each illustration.



EXTENSION

For this activity you will need to put a layer of shaving cream (or whipped cream, sand, salt or flour works too!) on a tray. The goal is for your child to recall all the words they've learned (including the two extra words: tiger and monkey) solely using their memory. Every time they come up with one of the key words, they will have to say it out loud, let you know what it means in their mother tongue, and then practice their writing skills by tracing/writing the word in shaving cream with their finger. After one round of writing, time your child and see if they can recall and write the new vocabulary in 2 minutes. Can they do it in 1?




