POSTER

Discuss with your child what are some things they know about seasons. Grab a large piece of paper and put it on the floor. Draw 7 large windows (one for each new word) so that both, your children and you, can draw or write at least 5 things associated with each key word in it. What do you see when it's Fall? What does a rainy day look like? We suggest you play 'The Four Seasons from Vivaldi' as you move along the different areas of your poster, and to help your child with ideas if necessary.

WHAT DO YOU WEAR WHEN...?

In this imaginative weather game, you will say out loud one of this lesson's key words. You will then set a 1 minute timer and have your child dress accordingly for each occasion. For example, if you shout 'SNOW', your child should try and dress with a hat, gloves, a warm jacket, boots, etc. Once time is up, make sure you go over the meaning of the shouted out word. We suggest you alternate who is getting dressed, and we encourage you to try to fool your child by putting on a swimsuit whenever they shout out 'Winter'.

Progress Tracker

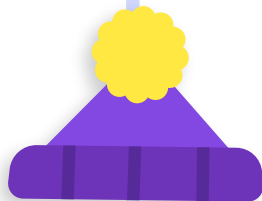

TRACKER ACTIVITY 1

For this activity you will need different items of clothing we use in different weather conditions, plus a large plastic bag, or tote bag. Here's a list of some of the items we suggest you include: sunglasses, umbrella, rain boots, raincoat, gloves/hat, cap etc. Pull out the items one at a time from the bag, show them to your child and ask them: 'What's the weather like when we use (name of the item)?'. 'What season do you usually wear this in?' Wait for them to respond. Now, if necessary, you can go over the different vocabulary words in English and ask them to repeat them after you before you start this activity.



TRACKER ACTIVITY 2

Using post-it notes, have your child write down this lesson's key words (one word per post-it). Have your child close their eyes while you put the different notes in random places around your house. Ask your child: 'Can you find me the (key word translated to your mother tongue)?'. Have them wander around until they find the post-it note with that word written in it. Do this as many times as necessary and mark the results accordingly on the table below

EXTRA CHALLENGE

For this activity you will need a device to play music. You can do this activity indoors or outdoors, it's entirely up to you! Get your child to move around while you play music. Stop the music and shout out one of the key words in this lesson: sun, rain, snow, Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter, wind, clouds. Your child will have to represent that type of weather/season. You can do a couple of rounds and then have your child be the one shouting out the key words instead.

VOCABULARY MOBILE

For this activity you will need a piece of paper, colored pencils, string, scissors, and a clothes hanger. Ask your child to draw this lesson's vocabulary on a piece of paper. Then ask them to decorate their drawings and label them. Have your child cut out their drawings and, using the

scissors, help them make a hole above each individual drawing that is wide enough so that you can put string through it. Now cut 6 different lengths of strings and tie one end to one of the drawings, and the other end on the clothes hanger. Your child can now display their beautiful mobile including everything they have learned throughout this lesson!

BLOOM

You will read the following statements to your child and they will have to decide what season they belong to:

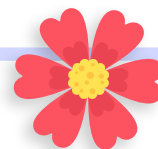
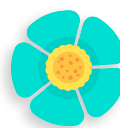
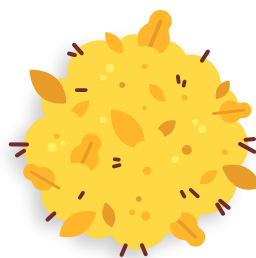
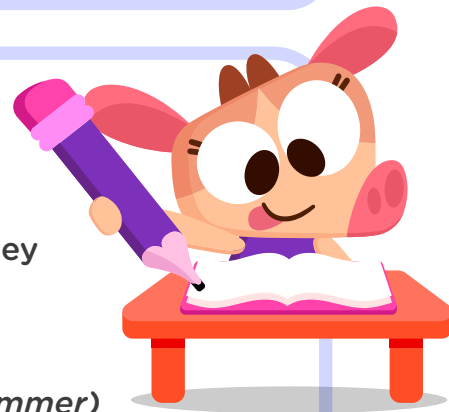
"Flowers come into bloom" (Spring)

"Leaves fall off the trees" (Fall)

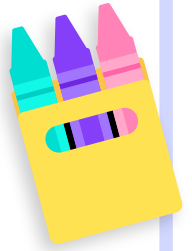
"It's so cold that sometimes it snows" (Winter)

Now, have your child grab a large piece of paper and place it vertically in front of them. Ask them to draw a tree trunk occupying the entire paper surface. As they finish, help them divide the paper into 4 equal parts. Now they will have to add the name of one of the seasons into each part and decorate it accordingly. If they need some inspiration to know what to draw on each drawing, repeat the statements you read to them at the beginning of this activity.

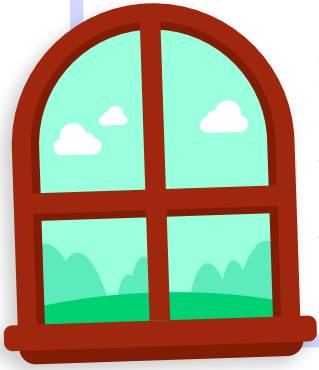


VOCABULARY WHEEL

For this activity you will need a piece of construction paper, a paper clip, a marker, and colored pencils. Your child will draw a circle occupying most of the space and will divide it into 9 equal parts. In each part they will write one of the key words and decorate it with drawings representing each concept. They will grab the paper clip, pinch it in the center of the wheel with one of the colored pencils, and flick it. Where did it land? Can they read the word? What does that word mean in their mother tongue? You both can take turns in order to review this lesson's vocabulary.



EXTENSION

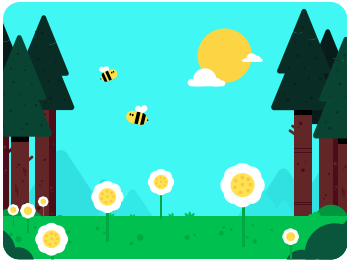


Look out the window together, talk about what you both can see e.g. clouds in the sky, trees moving in the wind, rain on the window...Use clues to help your child determine what the weather is like: 'Today the weather is cloudy!' You can repeat this activity throughout the week and make your own predictions and weather chart. You can write down the temperature, if there's wind/rain/snow/clouds, etc. At the end of the week, do your predictions match reality?
